School Sports

Pupils participated in Cross Country Athletics and Gaelic football in term 1. Pupils from Third to Sixth Class participated in swimming in UL for five weeks in Term 2. Pupils participated in Sports Hall Athletics in UL and a Multi – Sport event in TÚS. The Senior Classes participated in the FAI School Soccer League. In term 3 pupils participated in hurling, camogie, basketball, Limerick City track athletics in UL and yoga.

Curricular Development

Pupils participated in the Junior Entrepreneur Programme, Analog Robotics and the RDS Science Blast. The School celebrated Maths Week, Seachtain na Gaeilge, World Book Day and a Fitness Week for pupils and staff. All pupils attended a drumming work shop in April. Pupils participated in the Peace Proms in UL in February and in the Yes to Languages Programme. We developed an indoor Sensory Space and our outdoor Sensory Garden.
